George Dobinson 1927-1995

This concert celebrates the life of George Dobinson, who was well known to many of the people here tonight.

George conducted the CCO for more than twenty five of its thirty years until his death in December 1995, and was only its second conductor. Tonight the orchestra is playing many of his favourite pieces, including several that were featured in its highly successful twenty fifth anniversary concert in 1992.

George became associated with the CCO shortly after it was started, in 1967, by local amateur musicians and former members of the BBC Concert Orchestra. Largely thanks to him, the orchestra carved out a much needed niche, and now performs to members of the community who would otherwise not have the chance to hear live music. Many of its concerts are in local old people's homes and hospitals, and it has even performed in a prison.

The CCO's main purpose is for music to be fun. Under George's guidance, the orchestra has always tried to convey a real sense of enjoyment of the music it plays. With its mixture of traditional and light classical music, jazz and musical/film scores, the CCO fills a much needed gap between the traditional community ensemble and the semi-professional classical orchestra. As a result, it appeals to a broad range of audiences and players.

Apart from his work with the CCO, George was well known in Cambridge musical circles. He was organist at this, the Wesley Church, for a long time, and was also conductor of several local choirs and orchestras. In addition, he conducted or played in many classical music, opera and jazz performances throughout Cambridgeshire, in London and countryside.

George had a great love of animals, so tonight's collection is in aid of the Wood Green Animal Shelters.
